

Action Groups:

# Aging/Elder Care:

- There are plans for an event this Spring in either March or April with some focus around Power of Attorney (POA) possibly in both the Bedford and Moneta area.
- The group is also working on a Senior Survey to identify gaps.
- The group is working with Bedford County Sheriff's Office on bringing TRIAD back to the community.

Childcare: The group is in the process of getting together with local employers regarding their needs and concerns surrounding childcare.

Healthy Foods: The group has conducted a review of the event at Elba in the fall. There are plans to conduct a similar event. The group is looking to see what they can make an impact on this year and are working closely with the Cooperative Extension. The group will be creating a strategic plan.

# Housing:

- Point in time survey was held on January 25, 2023. The Town Police Department did not find anyone on that date. Numbers from the domestic violence shelter will be used. Shepherd's Table and Bedford Christian Ministries will also ask if there was anyone who did not have shelter on that night.
- CHIA needs a new hotline specialist.
- There is a warming shelter that has been open on Friday, Saturday and Sunday nights since January 14, 2023. To date, 15 people have spent the night and they are averaging 2 people per night. So far 262 volunteer hours have been completed. There is a need for more volunteers to work as overnight hosts especially women in order to accommodate any women that may come through. The warming shelter will operate weekends through March 19th, 2023 at 112 Center Street. If you are interested in volunteering please contact Tim Brook at St. Johns Episcopal Church at 540-586-9582. Employment and Training: There was a meeting in January and the notes have been uploaded to the website. The group will meet with the Chamber in February to work with businesses on their needs. The group is working with Workforce Development to expand their services.

Minds Together: The group continues to meet virtually on the 1<sup>st</sup> Thursday of each month at 10am. January the film Resilience was shown, and Jan Davis led a conversation afterwards. The group is looking to incorporate Trauma Informed Community Networks (TCIN) into the meetings. At the February Minds Together Meeting Joe Girandola will present on the Homeless Grant through Horizon for individuals aged 12-25.

Transportation: On January 23, 2023, The Otter Bus began running on Mondays so it now runs Monday, Wednesday, Friday and Saturdays from 10-4 with the possibility of extended hours in the Spring and Summer.

## **Key Partners:**

Bedford Area Reentry Council: This group is getting back into full swing. The next meeting is February 10, 2023 at 1pm and is virtual. There will be a presentation about what Probation and Parole is and what they do. If you are interested reach out to Tecora Johnson at Probation and Parole.

Bedford Community Action Team: A meeting with Judge Harrison has occurred and a Strategic Planning meeting is being planned with Denny Huff facilitating. This will run along side the 5 year plan of the Promoting Safe and Stable Families (PSSF) Grant.

Bedford Get Together: The ByLaws and Strategic Plan have just been finished. The group is trying to do smaller projects in the community throughout the next year.

Community Health Needs Assessment: Partnership for Healthy Communities is changing direction. They are working with Lynchburg to make a BARC like entity there.

Crime Prevention Council: This group met on January 26, 2023 and are reorganizing to update their plan, mission, and partners. Lt. Swain will be the chair and will work closely with the new Community Resource Office Travis Thomas.

Domestic Violence Coalition: The coalition did a Raffle and gave away a Moped. They raised \$1500. They are continuing to work on transitional housing.

Dannielle Tosh, Bedford County Social Services Benefits Programs Manager discussed the ending of emergency SNAP allotments and Medicaid unwinding. The last emergency allotment of SNAP will go out on February 16, 2023 and participants will go back down to normal allotments. This is not appealable. The work requirement is coming back along with time limited benefits. Medicaid unwinding will start on April 1, 2023 and will take a year to review all cases. Many who have been receiving Medicaid will no longer receive Medicaid.
